Dear Parents/Carers,

As we approach the end of the school year there are a number of important dates and notices below to share with you.

End of Summer Term Arrangements

The last day of term for all pupils is Friday 17 July 2026. Pupils will be dismissed from the site at 11:10. If your child is entitled to a free school meal, you will receive a text/in-app message with a link to complete an online form (one form per child) confirming that you would like them to collect a packed lunch before they are dismissed.

Punctuality

Pupils need to arrive at the school site ready to enter by 08:30; pupils who arrive before this time are welcome to use our free breakfast club in West Canteen. The school gates are locked at 08:37, so any pupil arriving after this will be marked as late and will receive a 30-minute detention.

Reusable Water Bottles

As part of our commitment to sustainability—driven by the work of our Year 8 pupils on their Solutions for The Planet project—we are a single-use plastic-free site. Therefore, please ensure your child brings a reusable water bottle when they return to school. Water bottle filling stations are available around the school for pupils to use.

Learning Wallets

All pupils have been issued with a learning wallet which includes all equipment they will need in the classroom to ensure no lost learning time. Please can you make sure your child keeps this safe over the summer holidays and brings it with them on their return in September as new ones will not be issued. Pupils also need remember to bring a school bag with them every day to carry their learning wallet and any learning materials.

ParentPay

Please ensure you top up your account before the start of the Autumn Term. This also applies to pupils bringing packed lunches or those eligible for Free School Meals. If your child is eligible for Free School Meals, you may top up their account if they wish to make purchases beyond their daily allowance. If you have not yet activated your account, you can request your login details by calling the School Office at 0121 783 7807 or emailing enquiry@hodgehill.bham.sch.uk.

Free School Meals

From September 2026, the Government has expanded eligibility for free school meals. This means that more families may now qualify, particularly those receiving Universal Credit. I strongly encourage you to [check your eligibility via the online service](#) on our website even if you are unsure. You can also telephone or come into school and complete a Free School Meals application online with a member of staff if you prefer. Please make sure you have the National Insurance Number with you for the named person who receives either working tax credit/child tax credit, and we will be happy to help.

Uniform

Pupils are expected to attend school in full uniform, including the Hodge Hill College tie, blazer, and black shoes. I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents and carers of our expectations regarding PE kit: no hoodies are allowed in school, and jogging bottoms should be plain navy. We are pleased to advise that a quarter-zip top has now been added to our PE kit. This item is available to purchase from our uniform suppliers, Mansuri Schoolwear and Clive Marks.

We're Going Phone Free with Yondr

We're committed to creating a learning environment where every student can thrive. Our young people are growing up in an increasingly complex world, living their lives on and offline. This presents many exciting opportunities - but also academic, emotional and social challenges. Beginning Wednesday 2 September 2026, we will launch the [Yondr Phone-Free Schools Programme](#). This isn't just about limiting screen time, it's about giving pupils the space to think deeply, engage meaningfully, and thrive in an environment designed for their growth.

For over a decade, Yondr has supported schools in more than 40 countries to build healthier, more engaging school cultures. Their pouch-based program, combined with hands-on guidance and dedicated support, has led to powerful results:

- 86% reported improved safety and pupil wellbeing
- 84% saw increased engagement in class
- 44% reduced behavioural referrals

How the Programme Works

Each pupil will be assigned a Yondr pouch - a secure, lockable case for storing personal electronic devices. Pupils are responsible for bringing their pouch to and from school each day and keeping it in good condition.

- **Upon arrival:** Pupils power off all smart technology including their mobile phones, smart watches and air pods, place all devices in the pouch, and lock it in front of their tutor
- **During the day:** Pupils keep the locked pouch in their bag
- **At dismissal:** Pupils unlock pouches at designated stations to retrieve their devices. The phone is taken home by the pupil ready for the next school day

This process is quick, simple, and will be supervised by staff as part of our daily routine.

Staying Connected
